of the President in office at the time, to whomever they wish.*

WESTBROOK LANE CROSSING

There is an manned level crossing which will have to be crossed to get to the ploughing and plashing site for the quickest access by foot. There are automatic lights to warn pedestrians on imminent arrivals. Any persons crossing must adhere to the rules laid down by Network Rail. Collingham and District Agricultural Society cannot accept any responsibility for any accident or injury incurred. There is access for exhibitors via Hewson's Lane for the ploughing plots over an automatic crossing which will be clearly signposted on Show Day.

PLEASE TAKE CARE

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RULES FOR COLLINGHAM AND DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY

1. All Exhibits shown shall be the property of the Exhibitor and have been in his possession at least three months previous to the time of showing; and any member showing stock for competition contrary to this Rule shall be disqualified from partaking of any Prize in the Class in which such stock shall be entered
2. Any objection to any exhibit must be made in writing to the Secretary before 2.30pm on the day of the Show, with a deposit of £5, which will be retained if, in the opinion of the Committee, such an objection is frivolous. The Committee formed to hear any objection to consist of three members, who at the discretion of the Chairman, may be Himself, the President, the Secretary or a Steward of the Section to which the dispute or objection relates.
3. The Judges shall have the power to withhold prizes in any class where the quality exhibited shall not be of sufficient merit to entitle them to a prize.
4. All prize winning Cattle must take part in the Prize Winners' Parade, otherwise their prize money shall be forfeited.
5. No animals to leave the showground until after the grand parade, all other exhibits 5.30pm. Unless stated otherwise.
6. All Produce shown must be grown on land occupied by the Exhibitor. Any Exhibitor showing Produce contrary to this Rule shall be disqualified from partaking of any prize in the Class and shall forfeit any prize money he may have been awarded in any Class in the Show and shall be prohibited from exhibiting at any future Show.
7. Any Exhibit not present when judging of that Class commences shall be disqualified.
8. THE COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CANCEL OR AMALGAMATE ANY CLASS OWING TO INSUFFICIENT ENTRIES.
9. The Society, its Officers or Servants, shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss, however caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant, or, to any animal, article, or property brought into the Showground, or, while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the said Showground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to or occasioned by, or, arising from any animal, article, or property exhibited or brought onto the Showground by him, he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned. It is therefore recommended that exhibitors insure against fire and such liabilities as the exhibitor may incur under the Show's Regulations
10. It is a show society requirement that all Exhibitors are asked to have Public Liability Insurance Cover.
11. No alcohol is to be taken on the Show site. There will be a fully licensed bar at which alcohol can be purchased. Anyone attempting to bring alcohol on to the Show site will be denied entry.
12. All Exhibitors and their Servants entering the Show Ground will be subject to the Orders, Rules and Regulations of the Society and the Officers appointed by the Society.
13. There will be no vehicle movement on the show site between the hours of 10am and 5.30pm unless approved by the Health & Safety Steward.

HORSE PLOUGHING

RULES FOR HORSE PLOUGHING CLASS

1. All ploughmen shall best plough a quarter of an acre of land not less than 5 inches deep with a pair of horses and one driver, within four and a half hours.
2. Each ploughman will be allowed the use of two wads only, with assistance to set them and pick them up. Competitors may have the assistance of a leader until four top rounds completed. No other assistance will be allowed during the match. He must set one ridge, show four top rounds and finish one furrow.
3. Ploughmen to be at the plough field at 9.00am to obtain plot numbers and start ploughing at 9.30am sharp finish four top rounds by 11.00am, complete work by 2.00pm, or competitor will be disqualified.
4. In the event of any dispute the matter will be referred to the Objections Committee and their decision shall be final. The objector shall deposit £5 with the stewards which shall be forfeited to the funds in case the objection shall be held to be frivolous.
5. Any adjustment made by, or at the suggestion of, any person other than the competitor during the course of the competition will result in immediate disqualification.
6. No extension of time allowed.

PRIZES: 1st - £20, 2nd - £10, 3rd - £5

NO ENTRY FEE

CLASS 1 To the man who shall plough a quarter of an acre of land not less than 5 inches deep in the best manner in the specified time with a single-furrow plough of any description.

NOTE: Each team completing the Plot on time will be paid the sum of £50.00.

OPEN TRACTOR PLOUGHING CLASSES

RULES FOR TRACTOR PLOUGHING CLASSES

1. Ploughmen in all classes to be at the field by 9.00am to start ploughing at 9.30am. All ploughmen to be finished by 1.30pm.
Ploughmen to plough as per catalogue number.
2. Each competitor will be allowed the use of three wads only with one assistant to set them and pick them up. No other assistance will be allowed during the Match.
3. All competitors to open ridge and plough 11 or 12 seams around the rig.
4. Depth in Classes 2 & 3 must be a minimum of 8 inches and in Classes 4, 4a & 5 a minimum of 6 inches. Failure to plough the specified depth will be penalised at 25 points per half inch below specified depth.
5. No rolling of opening splits allowed with the exception of the Vintage Classes.

6. Headlands will be chipped out and competitors set in and take out at this mark. Judges will be instructed to take special note.
7. In the event of any dispute, the matter will be referred to the Objection Committee and their decision will be final. The objector shall deposit £5 with the Stewards which shall be forfeited to the funds should the objection be held to be frivolous.
8. No attachments to plough allowed except in the Class specified.
9. Any adjustments made by or at the suggestion of any persons other than the competitor will result in immediate disqualification.

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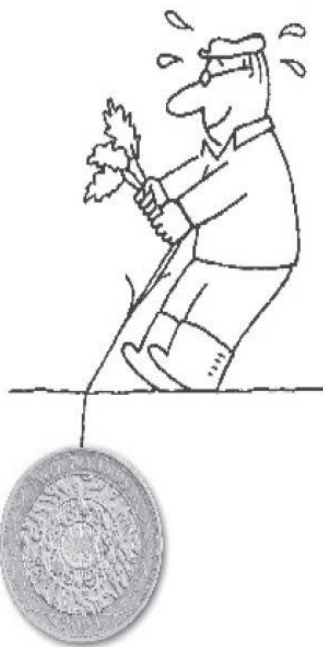

Class 110	Chocolate Cake (dairy free and suitable for a vegan diet)

150g dairy free spread, 300ml dairy free milk (oat milk works well), 1tbsp cider vinegar,

300g self raising flour, 200g golden caster sugar, 4 tbsp cocoa powder, 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda, ½ vanilla extract.

For the chocolate icing cream – 100g dairy free dark chocolate, 200g dairy free spread, 400g icing sugar, 5 tbsp cocoa powder, 1 tbsp dairy free milk.

Preheat oven to 190°C/ 170°C fan/ Gas 5. Grease and base line 2x20cm (approx) sandwich tins.

Mix the vinegar and dairy free milk in a jug (It may split but don't worry). Put all the other ingredients in a bowl. Pour in the milk mixture and beat well. Divide the mixture equally between the tins. Bake for 25-30 min, until a skewer comes out cleanly. Leave to cool in tins for 10 minutes then turn onto a cooling rack.

Icing cream. Melt the chocolate in bowl in the microwave then leave to cool for five mins. Meanwhile beat the dairy free spread and icing sugar then sift in the cocoa powder. Add the cooled chocolate and the milk, mixing until smooth.

Sandwich the cooled sponges and decorate the top.

100g coconut oil, 175g rolled oats, 100g chopped pecan nuts, 50g pumpkin or sunflower seeds, 50g chia seeds, 40g dried coconut, 75g dried cherries, cranberries or blueberries, 100g chopped figs or dates, ½tsp vanilla extract, 115g honey, 40g brown sugar
Pre heat oven to 180 °c/fan 170/ gas 4 and grease and line a 20x30cm baking tin.

Toast the oats, pecans and pumpkin seeds in the oven until lightly golden then mix with the chia seeds, coconut, dried fruit and vanilla. In a pan heat the coconut oil, honey and sugar, stir until the sugar melts then simmer for two minutes. Add this to the oat mixture and tip into the tin, spread and press down. Bake for approx. 25 mins. until lightly golden on top. Cool well in pan before turning out and cutting.

Sticky Spiced Squash Loaf – optional dairy free.

1 small butternut squash (approx. 500g), 2tsp fresh grated root ginger, 200g light muscovado sugar, 100g black treacle, 2tbsp plain yoghurt, 150ml sunflower oil, 1tsp vanilla extract, 3 large eggs beaten, 300g SR flour, ½ tsp salt, ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda, 2tsp cinnamon, 2tsp ground ginger.

Pre heat oven to 180 °c/ gas 4. Grease and line a 1kg loaf tin with parchment.

Cut the squash in half, scoop out the seeds and score the flesh. Place cut sides down on a baking sheet and cover with foil. Roast for 40-60 mins until the flesh is soft and cooked. Cool then scoop out 300g of flesh and mash with a fork in a mixing bowl. Add fresh ginger, sugar, treacle, yoghurt, oil, vanilla and eggs then whisk well. Sift remaining ingredients into another bowl then quickly add the wet ingredients mixing until smooth. Tip into the loaf tin taking care not to overfill. Bake for 50-60 minutes and test with a skewer. Leave to cool for 10minutes then turn out onto a wire rack to cool completely.

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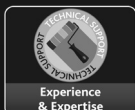
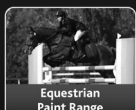
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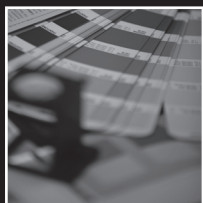
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
